

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COVID WAYS OF WORKING

It seems that as a sector we have done more than respond and recover. We have used the opportunity of COVID-19 to help us thrive. ESF recently hosted an insight conversation where three leaders explained how their organisations have been forced to adapt to COVID and how they have been pleasantly surprised by the outcomes that resulted.

Kate Sibert explained that Red Cross reimagined how its IMT can work online, inconceivable just a few months ago. While the sudden shift to remote work drained IT and corporate services it also loosened up shift planning and resourcing enabling an older volunteer workforce to contribute safely.

Stephen Griffin has seen operations, service delivery and culture change at VicSES. He said new regular online meetings with senior leaders means there is no delay or filtering of messages, but notes valuable corridor catch ups are missed. People still need human connection and it will be a matter of finding a balance in future that meets a range of needs.

Nigel Taylor said new ways of working led to greater engagement of LSV volunteers with increased meeting attendance and participation in their online Awards event. It has also become clear that as home and work integrate more through remote work arrangements, people will need to get to know other better & consider different, often challenging circumstances.
